Learning from survivors of abuse

Statistically, one in four children will experience some form of abuse – sexual, physical, emotional or neglect – during their childhood. Sadly, most child abuse goes either unnoticed or unreported, due to fear, a lack of knowledge in what constitutes abuse, or a reluctance to get involved. Safe adults have a responsibility to learn from survivors about abusive situations that went unresolved or unreported, to protect children from harm. GOSPEL MEDITATION**July 6, 2025****14th Sunday in Ordinary Time****Luke 10:1-12, 17-20**

In the days after the awful 2020 killing of George Floyd, a Catholic friend remarked, “Racism is today’s great evil. We should put all our energy into fighting it.” I admired her intuition that the church must stand firmly against evil. Amen, I thought. At the same time, something felt wrong.

As months went by, I saw her steadily slide into bitterness and anger. Soon, despondency. She spoke of giving up the fight. Don’t we too wonder how to fight evil without losing our joy or energy?

Jesus’ words this week help. He says, “Rejoice not that you have power over demons, but that your names are written in heaven” (Luke 10:20). Notice the asymmetry in where he wants our focus: on the latter, not the former. Should we confidently embrace our God-given power to overcome evil? Absolutely. But even more so, we should emphasize the positive element of our relationship to God. It is tempting but dangerous to define ourselves by what we oppose. It is better to define ourselves by—to rejoice in—what we celebrate: in Jesus, God has written our names in heaven. This sustains our battles.

This week, our marching orders are: fight evil. But more deeply, rejoice that God knows and loves us personally, individually. We allow this joyful knowledge to undergird our fight against the darkness of our day. Then we enjoy long-term stability to be cheerful warriors, who never forget the reason for the contests we are called to fight and win: love.

Dear Parishioners,

Society has now accepted emails one of the ordinary ways of communicating. It has also become a means where someone can create mischief or even evil. Phishing emails can sometimes appear to come from familiar contacts including me, your pastor, making them harder to detect. Here are some key indicators to help you identify such phishing emails:

1. **Unexpected Requests:** Be cautious of emails from known contacts asking for sensitive information, money transfers, urgent actions that seem out of character, or an invitation to access a shared document or files.
 2. **Unusual Language or Tone:** Pay attention to the language and tone of the email. If it seems unusual or inconsistent with the sender's typical communication style, it could be a phishing attempt.
 3. **Suspicious Links or Attachments:** Even if the email appears to be from someone you know, do not click on links, or download attachments unless you expected the communication from the person, and you verified with the sender that they sent the message.
 4. **Email Address Discrepancies:** Check the sender's email address carefully. Sometimes phishing emails use addresses that look like legitimate ones but have slight variations in spellings or replace letters with numbers.
- If you receive a phishing email, please take the following actions:

1. **Do Not Click on Links or Attachments:** Do not click on any links or download attachments from suspicious emails.
 2. **Verify with the Sender:** If you are unsure about the email's legitimacy, contact the sender directly using a known and trusted communication method, like calling them on the phone to verify the request. Do not reply to the suspicious email.
 3. **Delete the Email:** Delete the email from your inbox. If the email is in fact legitimate, you can always recover deleted items. You cannot recover stolen passwords or money.
- Sadly, we live in a time where such safeguards are necessary to protect ourselves.
