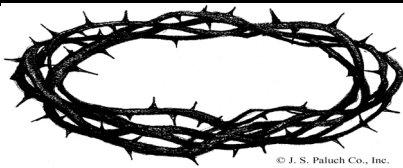

TOO MUCH INFORMATION!

There is a common expression: “Too much information!” We usually use it when people tell us details about their lives that we don’t want or need to know. Today, when James and John ask Jesus a simple question, making their request for places of honor in the kingdom, a simple answer might have been in order. Instead, as he often does, Jesus answers a question with a question; today it’s about drinking the cup of suffering. Then, once the others are indignant over James and John’s outrageous request, he proceeds to give them what may have been “too much information” for followers who were simply interested in the pursuit of glory. But this information, though it can sometimes seem “too much” for us, is essential for our lives as disciples. In Isaiah, in Hebrews, and in Mark today, we learn this information. It is in suffering, in weakness, in self-giving service to others, that we come to understand the kingdom. It is the information we need to find our place and come to be honored in the reign of God.

Did You Know?

We discuss the importance of physical boundaries quite a bit, teaching children to understand privacy and the difference between good touches and bad touches. But emotional boundaries are just as important, if not more so, because abuse victims are often manipulated into trusting and believing their abusers. Predators can violate emotional boundaries fairly easily, worming their way into a child’s life and creating a false relationship. Parents should talk to their children about appropriate boundaries for their emotional relationships — with teachers, the parents of their friends, and other adults in their lives. Children do not always have the emotional maturity to set their own boundaries, so parents should be on the lookout for anything that seems inappropriate or “off” about the relationships their children form with other adults. Los padres de familia deben hablar con sus hijos sobre los límites apropiados con sus relaciones emocionales, con los maestros, los padres de sus amigos y otros adultos en sus vidas. Los niños no siempre tienen la madurez emocional para establecer sus propios límites, por lo que los padres de familia deben estar atentos a cualquier cosa que parezca inapropiada o “desagradable” sobre las relaciones que sus hijos forman con otros adultos. 

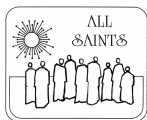

Dear Parishioners of Holy Cross:
 It was more obvious than I would admit. After a number of inquiries, I accepted the reality that many have noticed – thus this explanation. Recently, I have been having some issues with my sight. For these difficulties, I was referred to Bryant Lum, M.D. By the time I saw him on Thursday, October 11, 2018, I had lost vision in my left eye. After a brief examination, he immediately called Jeffrey Lutrull, M.D., and asked him to see me. It was late in the afternoon and Dr. Lutrull waited for arrival. His examine caused him to move quickly. Last Friday afternoon, October 12, 2018, Dr. Lutrull performed a procedure on my left eye with the hopes of restoring some of my vision.
 How much of my vision would be restored? Is there a need for a return surgical visit? These questions must remain for a little while.
 God is good. In this imperfect world, unexpected things are going to happen. However, in His Providence, the Lord made it possible for experts to give the assistance needed and at the time I needed it.
 You have heard me more than once speak of the beautiful mystery of intercessory prayer. Please ask My Lord to bless Dr. Lutrull and Dr. Lum for their professional attention and concern. Also, for me, please ask My Lord for His healing presence and if necessary the grace to carry this cross.

Existe una expresión de uso corriente: “Demasiada información para mi gusto”. Generalmente decimos esto cuando alguien nos da detalles sobre su vida que no deseamos o no necesitamos saber. Hoy, cuando Santiago y Juan le hacen una pregunta simple a Jesús y le piden ocupar lugares de honor en el Reino, Jesús podría haberles dado una respuesta simple. Pero, como suele hacerlo, responde una pregunta con otra pregunta, en este caso se trata de beber el cáliz del sufrimiento. Luego, cuando los demás se indignan contra el atrevido pedido de Santiago y Juan, Jesús les dice algo que puede haber sido “demasiada información” para el gusto de los seguidores, quienes sólo estaban interesados en alcanzar la gloria. Pero esta información, aunque algunas veces pueda parecer “demasiada” para nuestro gusto, es vital para nuestras vidas como discípulos. Hoy en Isaías, en hebreos y en Marcos, conocemos esta información: sólo mediante el sufrimiento, la debilidad y el servicio generoso a los demás comprenderemos el Reino. Ésta es la información que necesitamos para encontrar nuestro lugar y poder ser honrados en el Reino de Dios.
