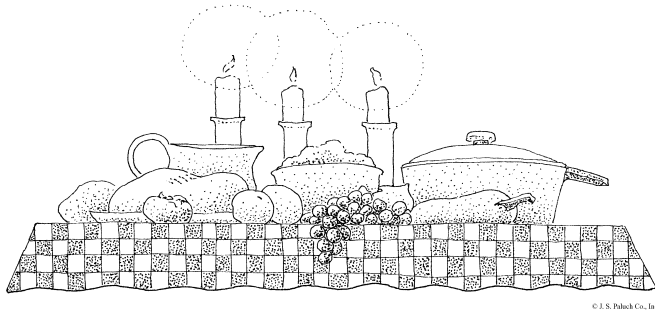
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Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

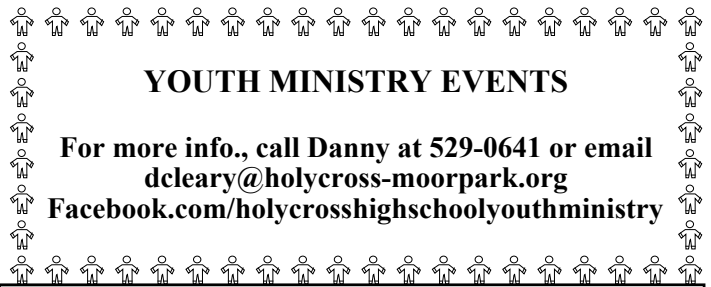

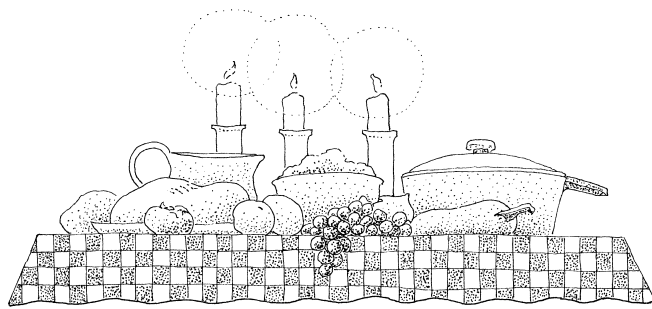

SENTIRSE BENDICIDO

¡Felicidades! ¡Bienvenido al Reino! ¡Alégrate y salta de alegría! Suena como algo de la Pascua, ¿cierto? Bueno, de una manera auténtica, lo es. Este domingo, las Escrituras nos recuerda que somos bendecidos y amados, especialmente cuando tenemos dificultades y no nos sentimos sobre todo bendecidos.
