WE ARE KNOWN BY OUR FRUIT

This week, Jesus tells us that we must examine our own inner selves, our attitudes and dispositions, virtues and faults, rather than judging others. What is in our hearts comes out in what and how we speak. If our hearts are filled with kindness and compassion, those qualities will be evident in our speaking, just as beautiful, wholesome fruit comes only from healthy trees. And vice-versa. The Wisdom writer Sirach in the first reading agrees with this concept—that we will be judged by our words. Paul reminds us that the reward of discipleship is eternal life. Today's psalm of thanksgiving and praise reminds us of God's kindness and faithfulness, which we are to emulate in our thoughts, words, and deeds. We are known, each of us, by our own fruit.

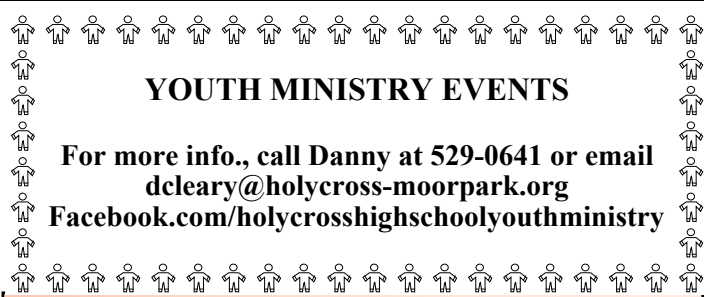

The University Series, 2022

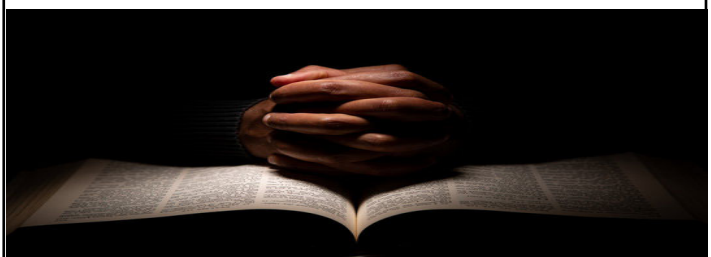
Registration is online only for the University Series this year and ends March 2nd. Go to www.theuniversityseries.org to pre-register for sessions. Single session passes may be purchased until the day

before the session. Some sessions will be virtual (as they were last year) and some will be in-person. Catalogs are available in the vestibule of the Church and all season pass holders from last year will receive a catalog in the mail. Find offerings to enhance your faith journey this Lent. Holy Cross is hosting two sessions this Lent. Our first – What Every Serious Christian Should Know About Judaism will be held on Tuesday, March 15th at 7 p.m. Rabbi Michael Lotker, a frequent presenter at the University Series, will explore the difference in the way the two faiths understand the Messiah, sin, redemption, salvation, repentance and forgiveness, with time for questions and discussion at the end.

Second – Our Place in the Universe. The dazzling diversity and profound underlying unity of our universe; how we humans fit into the grand cosmic scheme and why science and faith are compatible will be explained by Dr. Robert Piccioni on Tuesday, April 5th at 7 p.m. Holding a PhD. In high-energy physics and author of 50 physics books, he is also a college professor who has earned “Teacher of the Year” from his students at Osher Institute at UCLA and CSUCI. There will be time for your questions at the end of the presentation.
