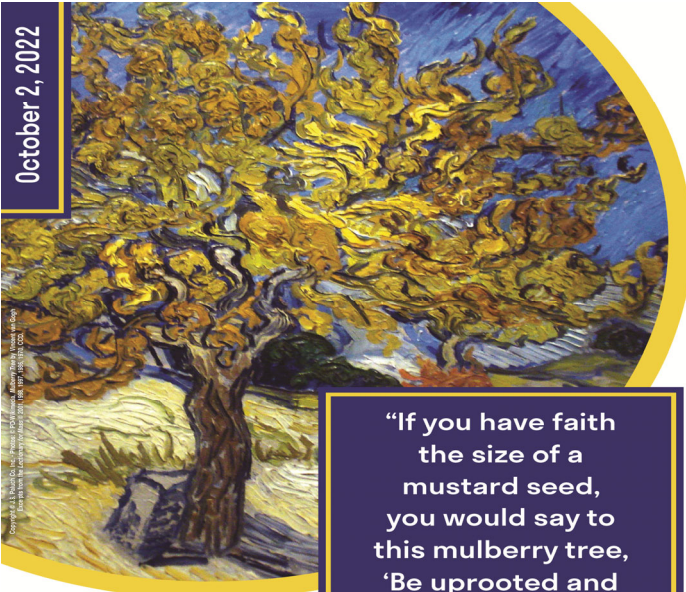

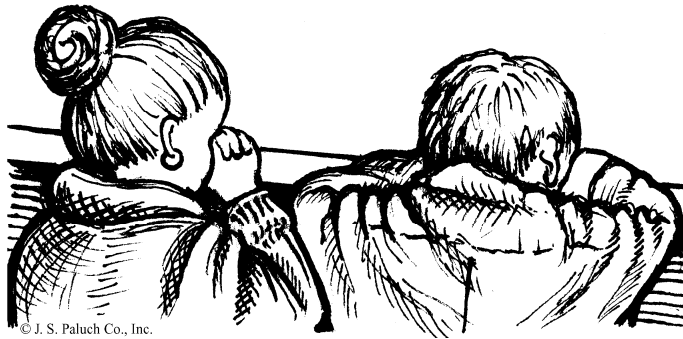

#### THE GIFT OF FAITH
