LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

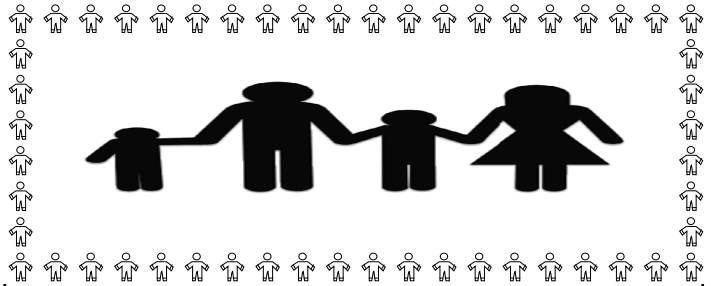

**GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE
DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE**
May 28, 2023
Pentecost Sunday

I hope you'll acknowledge with me a simple fact: it's not normal to have tongues of fire "part and come to rest" on people. It is actually pretty strange. Yet that is precisely what we celebrate in this feast of Pentecost. How can this mean something to us in our daily lives?

Jews had a tradition that heaven is a temple made of bricks of fire. So, through the apostles, the heavenly temple is coming to earth. But this fire looks like tongues, not bricks. That means that heavenly speech will be crucial to building a dwelling place for God on earth among men and women. So, it's no surprise when the apostles begin to speak in a miraculous way that is understood by all language groups. They are speaking of what God has done in and through Jesus: bringing heaven to earth and uniting all peoples to God and to each other.

How often our speech divides: gossip, slander, insults, and so on. How strange and rare it is when people speak in ways that truly unite instead of divide. Imagine how powerful it would be if you and I began to speak at home, at work, and in our community in a way that made people hear heavenly speech. Imagine if you spoke of the mighty deeds of God in a way that everyone could understand. That's precisely what the Holy Spirit descends upon us to do. Ask Him to come as a tongue of fire to you once again, and He will. Then speak!

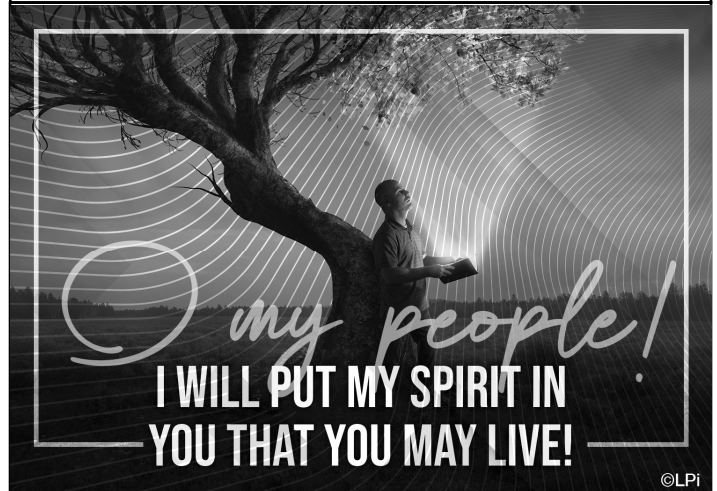
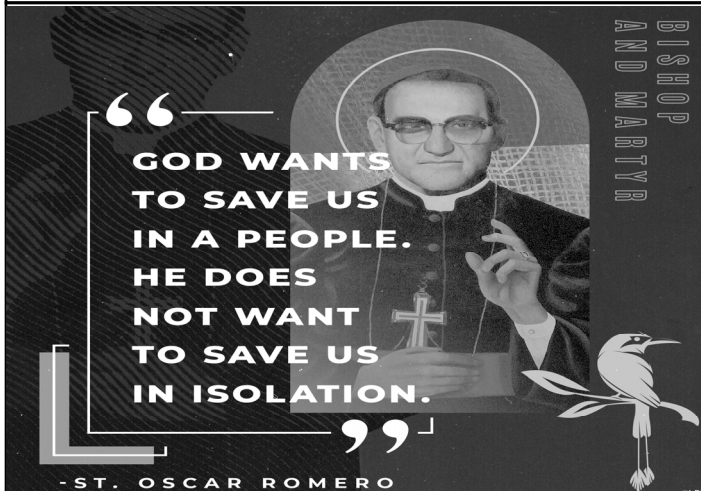

Domingo de Pentecostés

Hoy celebramos la solemnidad de Pentecostés, y con esta celebración terminamos la Pascua, la cual iniciamos el Domingo de Resurrección. El Domingo de Pentecostés tiene como objetivo hacer que Jesús resucitado continúe vivo en la Iglesia. Se terminó el miedo en los discípulos que estaban a puerta cerrada. Jesús entra y los saluda: “¡La paz esté con ustedes!” (Juan 20,19). El Evangelio de hoy nos muestra cómo Jesús sigue vivo entre nosotros, si practicamos la paz. La paz se consigue de muchas formas, dialogando: escuchando y perdonando. Jesús sopla sobre ellos y les dice: “Reciban al Espíritu Santo: a quienes descarguen de sus pecados, serán liberados, y a quienes se los retengan, les serán retenidos” (Juan 20, 22-23).

La presencia de Dios, a través del Sacramento de la reconciliación, renueva, fortalece y transforma nuestras tristezas en alegrías. Es decir, su gracia, por medio del Espíritu Santo, nos da fortaleza para seguir en el camino de la perfección. Renueva en nosotros los dones del Espíritu Santo para anunciar al mundo que Dios sigue vigente, que no nos ha abandonado, que vale la pena seguir luchando y trabajando por un mundo mejor. Entonces sabremos que el Espíritu Santo está en nosotros. Recemos con frecuencia esta oración: “Reparte tus siete dones según la fe de tus siervos. Por tu bondad y tu gracia dale al esfuerzo su mérito; salva al que busca salvarse y danos tu gozo eterno” (Secuencia de Pentecostés). ¡Ven Espíritu Santo y renueva la faz de la tierra!

(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

The Fame Communicated

"Fire! Fire! They're all gonna die! They're all gonna burn up!"

I had absolutely no hope of restoring order as I read the story of Pentecost with my young children last year. As soon as they glimpsed the tongues of fire hovering over the foreheads of the apostles, they were lost to giggles and shrieks. I sighed, sipped my coffee, and wondered resentfully why the Holy Spirit couldn't have chosen to be a dove on that particular day. Just a nice, peaceful dove.

I'll say this, though: the fire left an impression. It usually does, doesn't it? Fire consumes. It renews. It illuminates. It leaves you breathless with fear and awe. The memory and scent and impact of a flame lingers long after it is extinguished.

When I am trying to explain theology to my kids, I have an awful habit of overcomplicating things. I'd had a whole speech prepared for them about what the Holy Spirit is, but it went out the window as soon as they saw the flames. And you know what? It's probably for the best. They wouldn't have remembered that speech. The flames, though? The flames they remembered. The flame communicated.

As a result of Pentecost, the apostles suddenly had the ability to give the truth to foreigners. Aliens. People who were heretofore beyond their reach, isolated by language. The flame communicated.

God's sense of timing is impeccable, and His delivery is carefully crafted. And on Pentecost, the Holy Spirit did not descend as a dove or pour forth as water.

On Pentecost, the Holy Spirit burned.

La Fama Comunicada

"¡Fuego! ¡Fuego! ¡Todos van a morir! ¡Todos se van a quemar!"

No tenía absolutamente ninguna esperanza de restaurar el orden cuando leí la historia de Pentecostés con mis hijos pequeños el año pasado. Tan pronto como vieron las lenguas de fuego flotando sobre las frentes de los apóstoles, se perdieron entre risas y gritos. Suspiré, tomé un sorbo de mi café y me pregunté con resentimiento por qué el Espíritu Santo no pudo haber elegido ser una paloma en ese día en particular. Solo una paloma agradable y pacífica.

Sin embargo, diré esto: el fuego dejó una impresión. Suele pasar, ¿no? El fuego consume. Renueva. Ilumina. Te deja sin aliento con temor y asombro. El recuerdo, el olor y el impacto de una llama persisten mucho después de que se extingue.

Cuando trato de explicar teología a mis hijos, tengo la terrible costumbre de complicar demasiado las cosas. Les había preparado todo un discurso sobre lo que es el Espíritu Santo, pero se fue por la ventana en cuanto vieron las llamas. ¿Y sabes qué? Probablemente sea lo mejor. No habrían recordado ese discurso. ¿Las llamas, sin embargo? Las llamas recordaron. La llama se comunicó.

Como resultado de Pentecostés, los apóstoles repentinamente tuvieron la habilidad de dar la verdad a forasteros. Extranjeros. Personas que hasta ahora estaban fuera de su alcance, aisladas por el idioma. La llama se comunicó.

El sentido del tiempo de Dios es impecable, y Su entrega está cuidadosamente elaborada. Y en Pentecostés, el Espíritu Santo no descendió como paloma ni se derramó como agua.

En Pentecostés, el Espíritu Santo ardió.
